³ All students are required to report to the Institute for a check-in session. A \$50 late arrival fee is charged to new and returning students who miss the check-in session without notifying the Institute, or who check-in but do not attend the first week of classes.

⁴ Tuition must be paid by the end of the third day of classes. If you do not pay tuition on time, you will be charged a \$50 per week late fee and will not be allowed to attend class until payment is made.

⁵ Average figures include electricity, water, trash pickup and parking. They do not include nonrefundable application fees (\$160 average).

⁶ Average figures include minimum estimates of books, food, medical insurance, transportation, and incidental living expenses. The University of Florida requires students to carry medical insurance. The cost of medical insurance varies in price from term to term depending on such factors as length of study, age and marital status.

CURRICULUM

Full-Time Enrollment (23 Hours Per Week)

10 hrs Reading/Writing
8 hrs Listening/Speaking
5 hrs Grammar

Alternate courses, such as Business English, Conversation Strategies, Grammar for Writing, Literature, and Academic Bridge are available *when enrollment allows*.

Additional Courses (when enrollment allows)

5 hrs TOEFL
5 hrs Pronunciation per week for 6 weeks
5 hrs GRE/GMAT Preparation
5 hrs Vocabulary
5 hrs English for Standardized Tests

Any of the above courses may be added to full-time enrollment for an additional cost.

Part-Time Enrollment

Only for applicants who are not on F-1 student visas.

STUDENT SUPPORT
